In the past four years, Artisan:re has trained 1,000 farmers in regenerative practices like avoiding

chemicals, crop rotation, and composting, which improves soil health and supportes



Artisan:re is registered on Organic Cotton Accelerator (OCA), a platform that connects brands and philanthropic partners working together to positively impact the cotton sector and support farmers globally. 
serving as significant financial contributors and supporters. By fostering collaboration
